This catalogue is divided into sections, Flowers for Wildlife, Collections, Flower Meadow Mixes and finally, Sundries.

Each entry has the common and Latin name, the type, (perennial or annual etc.), the approximate height of the plant, when to sow, when you can expect it to flower, which soil type or position it prefers, the approximate number of seeds and a brief description. Please see our website for pictures. The flowering and sowing times should be adjusted, allowing for where you live.

The price is also shown along with the wildlife species it may attract and provide food for.

As we add new items to our stock, this seed catalogue will obviously become out of date but supplements or updates will regularly become available.

Bats This plant is listed in either the Bat Conservation Trust "Encouraging bats, A guide for bat-friendly

garden and living" or the "RHS Plants for Bats list".

Annual Plant flowers, set seeds and dies over the course of one year.

Biennial The plant forms leaves the first year and flowers in the second, set seeds and dies.

Perennial Plant usually flowers in the second year, (sometimes the first), dies down in the winter but re-

emerges in spring for several years.

Native Wildflower Has been present in Great Britain since at least the last ice age.

Naturalised Wildflower Archaeophytes, plants introduced by humans from before the Iron Age to round about AD 1500.

Achillea millefolium - Achillea - Pink Mix -

Perennial Cottage Garden Flower - 60cm - Sow February to July - Flowers May to August - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 900 seeds / 0.3g

RHS P4P Bats and some moths including larvae of the Belted Beauty moth.

A very attractive mix with flowers of palest pink through to deep pink. Long flowering, good cut flower, tolerant of drought once established.

Achillea millefolium - Yarrow

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 50 cm - Flowers summer - Sow spring, summer, early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 500 seeds / 0.1g

RHS P4P Moths, Butterflies, Hoverflies, Bats

Yarrow has feathery leaves and flattened heads of flowers, usually white but occasionally pink. It has long been used in herbal medicine as one of its other names, soldier's woundwort, implies.

Agastache Foeniculum - Anise Hyssop

Perennial Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 1m - Flowers summer - Inside - Sow inside in spring or summer, needs warmth at approx.15-18°C to germinate - Prefers full sun in well-drained soil. Will need winter protection in areas where the temperature falls below -5°C - Approx. 300 seeds / 0.15g

RHS P4P Bees

Anise Hyssop is a clump-forming plant with highly aromatic aniseed scented leaves. The pretty purple flower spikes are very popular with Bees and other pollinating insects. Dave Goulson in his, Gardening for Bumblebees calls it "One of the very best plants for bees,"

Agrostemma githago - Corncockle

Annual Naturalised Wildflower - 75 cm - Flowers in summer - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 75 seeds / 1.25g

RHS P4P Bats

Warning: All parts of this plant and particularly the seeds are toxic. Do not eat and keep away from children and pets.

Alcea Rosea - Hollyhock - Single Mixed

Biennial / Short-lived perennial Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 2m - Flowers summer - Sow late spring or summer - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 50 seeds / 0.5g

RHS P4P Bees, Bats

Tall, imposing plants with large single, open, saucer-like flowers in lovely shades from white to crimson. Very attractive to Bumblebees.

Allium schoenoprasum - Chives - Organically Grown Seeds

Perennial Culinary Herb - 30 cm - Flowers in summer - Sow late spring, or summer - Prefers rich, moist soil in sun but will tolerate most soils and conditions - Approx. 300 seeds / 1g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies

The grass-like leaves have a mild onion flavour. The purplish/pink globe flowers are also edible. Can be used whenever a mild onion flavour is needed.

Althaea officinalis - Marsh-mallow

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 2.5m - Flowers summer to early autumn - Sow late summer to autumn, the seeds need a period of cold before they will germinate well. You may get a few seedlings from a mid-summer sowing - Prefers a moist soil in sun but will tolerate other conditions including drier soil and partial shade - Approx. 110 seeds / 0.2g

Bees, Hoverflies, Marsh-mallow Moth caterpillars and Bats

good plant for a damp position in sun or partial shade.

Marsh-mallow is a tall plant with soft grey-green leaves and very pretty pale pink flowers from mid-summer into autumn. It is a very

Anthemis arvensis - Corn Chamomile

Annual Naturalised Wildflower - 20-30 cm - Flowers summer to early autumn - Sow spring, early summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun Approx. 4400 seeds / 1.1g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths, Hoverflies

Feathery aromatic leaves and daisy-like flowers with white petals and a yellow centre. Very pretty, long-lasting flowers loved by pollinators.

Anthemis tinctoria - Dyer's Chamomile

Perennial Cottage Garden Flower / Dye plant - 1m - Flowers late spring to early autumn - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 450 seeds / 0.17g

RHS P4P Bumblebees, Solitary Bees, Hoverflies, Bats

Very pretty daisy-like flowers in shades from cream to bright yellow above fragrant, finely cut leaves. Very popular with Bees and Hoverflies

Aquilegia - Granny's Bonnets - Surprise Mix

Perennial Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 1m - Flowers from late spring to early to mid-summer - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Moist or well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 150 seeds / 0.27g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies

Scotland

An easy to grow cottage garden favourite which will happily self-seed around your garden. These seeds are from the various Granny's Bonnets in our garden which include plants of various heights and colours from white through to dark purple. As the Bees have cross-pollinated these plants your seedlings may be single, double, bi-coloured, short or tall, but all will be pretty.

Aquilegia vulgaris - Columbine

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers May to July - Sow late summer or autumn as a cold spell needed for germination - Prefers moist soil in partial shade - Approx. 180 seeds / 0.26g

RHS P4P Bumblebees

This is the true wild form of Columbine with purplish blue flowers with hooked spurs. In the wild, most often found in woodland clearings.

Betonica officinalis - Betony

Perennial Native Wildflower - 40-60 cm cm - Flowers summer to early autumn - Sow late summer or autumn, needs cold to germinate - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 160 seeds / 0.27g

RHS P4P Bumblebees, solitary Bees

A pretty plant with pinkish purple flowers.

Borago officinalis - Borage - Organically Grown Seeds

Annual Herb - 60 cm - Flowers throughout summer to early autumn - Sow spring, early summer, early autumn - Any reasonably well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 120 seeds / 2g

RHS P4P Bees, Moths, Bats

Bright blue edible starry flowers, (can be frozen into ice cubes). Hairy leaves with a cucumber flavour can be added to drinks such as Pimms.

Calendula officinalis - Pot Marigold

Annual Cottage Garden Flower / Herb - Height up to 50 cm - Flowers summer into autumn - Sow spring, early summer, early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 150 seeds / 1.25g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths, Bats

Bright daisy-like orange flowers until the first hard frost. May sometimes survive the winter and put on new growth and flowers the following spring. Edible petals and is used as a food colouring and also in healing ointments.

Campanula trachelium - Nettle-leaved Bellflower

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers between June and September - Sow spring, summer, early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 1000 seeds / 0.38g

RHS P4P Bees

Pretty blue bell-shaped flowers which provide forage for Bumblebees and some solitary Bees.

Centaurea cyanus - Cornflower

Annual Naturalised Wildflower - 80 cm - Flowers summer & autumn - Sow spring or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 200 seeds / 1g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Bats

Soft green leaves with blue flowers. Although the individual flowers are short-lived, new ones continually open all summer into autumn.

Centaurea cyanus - Cornflower - 'Polka Dot Mixed'

Annual Cottage Garden Flower - 40 cm - Flowers summer & autumn - Sow spring or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 200 seeds / 1g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Bats

Soft green leaves with very pretty flowers in shades from pale pink, blue to deep purple. Not as tall as the native blue Cornflower but still as popular with pollinators.

Centaurea nigra - Common Knapweed

Perennial Native Wildflower - 75 cm - Flowers June to September - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 150 seeds / 0.33g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths, Beetles, Birds, Bats

Thistle-like purple flowers from very attractive buds. Loved by seed-eaters such as goldfinches.



Centaurea scabiosa - Greater Knapweed

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers summer into early autumn - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Moist but well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 45 seeds / 0.3g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths, Bats

Scotland

An upright plant with attractive buds opening to purple flowers. Very popular with Bees, Butterflies and Moths. A really striking plant for your flower border.

Centranthus ruber - Red Valerian

Perennial Country Cottage Flower - Up to 60-90 cm - Flowers summer - Sow mid-spring, summer, early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or semi-shade - Approx. 100 seeds / 0.2g

RHS P4P Butterflies, Moths, Bumblebees, Bats

Red Valerian is also known as Pretty Betsy. It has red or pink flowers which are very attractive to butterflies and moths and is often visited by Hummingbird Hawk-moths

Centranthus ruber - Red Valerian - White Form

Perennial Country Cottage Flower - Up to 60-90 cm - Flowers summer - Sow mid-spring, summer, early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or semi-shade - Approx. 100 seeds / 0.2g

RHS P4P Butterflies, Moths, Bumblebees, Bats

This white form is also known as Snowcloud. It has the same properties as the above Red Valerian but with white flowers.

Cichorium intybus - Chicory

Perennial Naturalised Wildflower - 1-15 m - Flowers in summer - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Rich, well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 400 seeds / 0.5g

RHS P4P Hoverflies, Bumblebees, Honeybees

Tall plant with beautiful blue flowers along its stem. The fresh young leaves and edible flowers can be added to salads.

Cosmos bipinnatus - Cosmos - 'Sensation Mixed'

Cottage Garden Flower - 1m - Flowers all summer until the first frosts - Sow spring- Well-drained soil in sun or partial - Approx. 100 seeds / 0.7g

RHS P4P Hoverflies, Bees, Bats

A tall plant with feathery leaves and large single flowers with yellow centres. This variety has flowers in shades of white through to deep pink.

Daucus carota - Wild Carrot

Biennial Native Wildflower - Up to 75cm - Flowers June to September - Sow late summer or autumn, the seeds need a period of cold to germinate - Well drained soil in sun - Approx. 100 seeds / 0.2g

Hoverflies, Butterflies

Wild Carrot has lacy leaves and the flowers are clustered in umbels. The buds often begin pink but open to white flowers often with one deep red flower in the middle. Also known as Queen Anne's Lace it's a very good source of both nectar and pollen for insects. When the flowers have finished the flower head bracts turn inwards to form a basket shape and the seeds that it contains are not unlike little hairy creatures.

Digitalis purpurea - Foxglove

Biennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers summer - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Moist but well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 5000 seeds / 0.38g

RHS P4P Bumblebees, Butterflies, Moths

Scotland

These tall wildflowers are very popular with Bumblebees not only as a source of pollen but sometimes also as an overnight roosting place. Often found in woodland, it is happy in partial shade but will also tolerate other sites.

Warning: All parts of the plant are poisonous.

Dipsacus fullonum - Teasel

Biennial Native Wildflower - Up to 2m - Flowers July and August - Sow late spring to early autumn - Any soil type in sun or partial shade - Approx.

175 seeds / 0.46g

RHS P4P

Bees and Goldfinches for the seeds

A tall plant with spiky stems and purple flowers that appear in rings on the flowerhead. Being biennial, the first year it forms a rosette of bristly leaves with flower-bearing stems appearing in the second year. The seed heads are very attractive to Goldfinches.

Echium vulgare - Viper's Bugloss

Biennial Native Wildflower - Up to 80cm - Flowers summer - Sow late spring to early autumn - Any well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 90 seeds / 0.36g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths

An upright plant with bristly stems, hairy leaves and bright blue flowers. It produces a flattish rosette of leaves in the first year with flowers appearing in the second. The plant will die after flowering but will often self-seed and produce new plants the following spring. May cause stomach upset if eaten and contact with foliage may cause skin irritation.

Exchscholzia californica - Californian Poppy - 'Mission Bells'

Hardy Annual Cottage Garden Flower - 25 cm - Flowers early summer to autumn - Sow spring, early summer, early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 300 seeds / 0.42g

RHS P4P Bees, Hoverflies

Compact bushy plants with feathery leaves and single or semi-double flowers in yellow, orange, pink or red. Very easy to grow and often self--seeds. We recommend successive sowing for flowers all summer long.

Eupatorium cannabinum - Hemp Agrimony

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1.5m - Flowers late summer to early autumn - Sow spring, summer, early autumn. - Damp soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 300 seeds / 0.1g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths, Bats

A tall upright bushy plant with reddish stems and clusters of tiny light pink flowers from late summer into autumn. In the wild, often found in marshes and damp grassland or woodlands. The flowers attract many different kinds of insects including Red Admiral and Small Tortoiseshell Butterflies.

Filipendula ulmaria - Meadowsweet

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers June to September - Sow late summer or autumn as needs a period of cold to germinate - Moist soil, in sun or partial shade - Approx. 400 seeds / 0.4g

RHS P4P Bees, Hoverflies, Bats and Moths including Scarlet Tiger Moth

Meadowsweet has sweet smelling, frothy, cream flowers. In the wild it is found where the ground is periodically wet such as damp meadows, fens, wet woodlands and ditches.

Foeniculum vulgare - Fennel

Perennial Culinary Herb - Up to 2m - Flowers summer - Sow mid-spring to early autumn - Fertile well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 500 seeds / 2.17g

RHS P4P Bees, Wasps, Beetles, Hoverflies, Lacewings and Bats

A tall impressive herb with feather leaves and umbels of yellow flowers which are very attractive to a wide range of beneficial insects. All of the plant has a distinctive, aniseed scent and taste. A very attractive, useful plant for both the herb garden and flower beds.

Galium verum - Lady's Bedstraw

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 50cm - Flowers June to September - Sow spring, summer, autumn - Moist to well-drained, neutral to alkaline infertile soil, in sun or semi-shade - Approx. 500 seeds / 0.6g

RHS P4P Bees, Moths including the caterpillars of several Hawk-moths.

This wildflower has a sprawling habit and frothy golden-yellow honey-scented flowers. It smells like new mown hay when dried.

Geranium pratense - Meadow Crane's-bill

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers June to September - Sow spring, summer, early autumn - Moist but well-drained soil, in sun or partial shade - Approx. 75 seeds / 0.75g

RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies

A clump-forming plant with violet flowers and deeply cut leaves. The attractive flowers are nectar-rich and loved by Bees.

Glebionis segetum - Corn Marigold

Annual Naturalised Wildflower - 30 cm - Flowers summer - Sow spring and early summer - Will tolerate most soils in sun - Approx. 350 seeds / 0.58g

RHS P4P Butterflies, Bees, Moths, Bats and Hoverflies

An upright plant with large bright yellow daisy-like flowers, very popular with pollinators.

Gypsophila elegans - Gypsophila—'Covent Garden' - Baby's Breath

Annual Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 45cm - Flowers summer - Sow spring to June or in September - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 1200 seeds / 1.5g

RHS P4P Particularly popular with Hoverflies

A graceful and delicate-looking plant with lacy green foliage and white flowers, also known as Baby's Breath.

Hypericum perforatum - Perforate St John's Wort

Perennial Native Wildflower - 30 to 90 cm - Flowers between June and September - Sow early to late spring or late summer, early autumn - Any reasonable soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 3000 seeds / 0.3g

RHS P4P Bees, Moths, Bats

Pretty star-shaped golden yellow flowers from June to September which are very popular with a variety of pollinators.

Warning: Perforate St. John's Wort may be toxic to animals and/or cause photosensitisation so best avoided in grassland/gardens where animals graze. Wear gloves when handling.

Hypericum androsaemum - Tutsan

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 75cm - Flowers summer - Sow late spring to early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun, partial shade or shade - Approx. 1500 seeds / 0.1g

Bees and Hoverflies

Grown in Scotland

Also known as Balm of the Warrior's Wounds and Sweet Amber, Tutsan is a bushy, shrubby plant with paired oval shaped leaves and small yellow flowers appearing from mid-summer onwards. These are followed by berries that mature from red to black with flowers and berries, (inedible), often present at the same time.

Willughby's Leafcutter Bees use the leaves to construct their nests.

Hypochaeris radicata - Cat's Ear

Perennial Native Wildflower - 50 cm - Flowers summer to autumn - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 150 seeds / 0.`15g

RHS P4P Bees, Hoverflies

Scotland

Cat's ear is a rosette-forming plant with hairy long leaves and bright yellow flowers similar to Dandelion, in summer through to early autumn. It is very popular with Hoverflies and Bees, particularly the smaller solitary bees.

Hyssopus officinalis - Hyssop

Hardy Perennial Herb - Up to 80cm - Flowers summer - Sow late spring to early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 500 seeds / 0.6g

RHS P4P Bees. Bat

A semi-evergreen shrubby herb with aromatic leaves and blue flowers. A good plant for hedging and loved by pollinators.

Inula helenium - Elecampane

Perennial Naturalised Wildflower - 2m - Flowers summer - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Prefers rich, deep, moisture-retentive soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 50 seeds / 0.09g

RHS P4P Bees, Hoverflies, Ground Beetles

Grown in Scotland

Very tall, impressive plant with leaves up to 60cm long. Large yellow flowers loved by Bees and Hoverflies. It may take a couple of years to reach full size and is unlikely to flower in the first year but it is worth waiting for.

Isatis tinctoria - Woad £2.00

Biennial Naturalised Wildflower / Dye Plant- Up to 1.2m - Flowers late spring and early summer - Sow spring, summer, early autumn - Moist but well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 50 seeds / 0.25g

RHS P4P Bee

A tall plant with long bluish-green leaves and yellow flowers in early summer that are popular with Bees, followed by dark brown seeds. The leaves produce the famous blue dye. Being biennial, the first year it produces leaves only and the flowers in year two. For plants in following years, leave the plant to self-seed.

Warning: Poisonous when taken internally. Keep out of the reach of children and pets.

Knautia arvensis - Field Scabious

Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers June to October - Sow spring, summer, early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 50 seeds / 0.4g

RHS P4P

Butterflies, Hoverflies, Bees, Bats, Moths, Birds

A clump-forming plant with lilac-blue flowers which are a valuable nectar source for pollinators. The seeds provide food for some bird species.

Lavatera trimestris - Lavatera 'Mont Blanc'

Annual Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 60cm - Flowers June to September - Sow March to May - Well-drained soil in sun with some shelter from the wind - Approx. 100 seeds / 0.64g

Bees

A dwarf mallow variety with a bushy habit, dark green leaves and glistening large white flowers which are very attractive to bees.

Leucanthemum vulgare - Ox-eye Daisy

Perennial Native Wildflower - 50-75 cm - Flowers summer - Sow spring, summer, early autumn - Moist but well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 1000 seeds / 0.5g

RHS P4P

Soldier Beetles, Hoverflies, Solitary Bees, Bats

A clump-forming plant with numerous big white daisy flowers which provide nectar for pollinators. Flowers mainly between June and August with the occasional flower outside of these months.

Levesticum officinale - Lovage

£2.00

Hardy Perennial Herb - Up to 2m - Flowers summer - Sow late spring to summer - Well-drained, rich, moist soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 130 seeds / 0.35g

RHS P4P Solitary Bees, Wasps, Hoverflies, Soldier Beetles

A tall herb with celery-flavoured leaves and yellow clusters of flowers in summer. It can be used to flavour stews and soups and the young leaves can be used in salads. (Use sparingly as it has quite a strong flavour).

Limnanthes douglasii - Limnanthes "Poached Egg Plant"

Annual Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 15cm - Flowers summer into autumn - Sow spring to early summer, early autumn - Moist soil in a sunny spot - Approx. 75 seeds / 0.58g

RHS P4P

Hoverflies, Bats

A bushy spreading plant with divided leaves and yellow flowers with white tips. A very useful ground-cover plant and loved by pollinators, especially Hoverflies.

Linaria purpurea - Purple Toadflax -

Perennial Cottage Garden Flower - Height up to 1m - Flowers summer into autumn - Sow spring or summer - Light and well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 1000 seeds / 0.13g

RHS P4P Bees, Moths, Bats

Scotland

An upright slender habit with very pretty spires of flowers in various shades of purple with grey-green narrow leaves. New buds continually open up the spires, keeping your bees happy until the first frosts.

Linaria vulgaris - Common Toadflax

Perennial Native Wildflower - 75 cm - Flowers from June throughout summer - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 500 seeds / 0.07g

RHS P4P

Moths and Bees including Buff-tailed and White-tailed Bumblebees

Very attractive creamy yellow and orange "snapdragon" flowers.

Linum grandiflorum - Crimson-flowered flax

Annual Cottage Garden Flower - 35 cm - Flowers in summer, make successive sowings for flowers all season - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 500 seeds / 1.9g

A good source of both nectar and pollen for insects.

Very pretty plant with narrow leaves and deep red silky flowers. Best grown in groups rather than singly.

Lunaria annual - Honesty - Purple and white mix

Biennial Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 75 cm - Flowers late spring to summer - Sow late spring or summer - Moist but well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 80 seeds / 1.6g

RHS P4P

Butterflies, Bats

The pretty flowers are followed by very decorative seedheads. The Orange-Tip Butterfly lays its eggs on Honesty which provides food for their caterpillars.

Lychnis flos-cuculi - Ragged Robin
