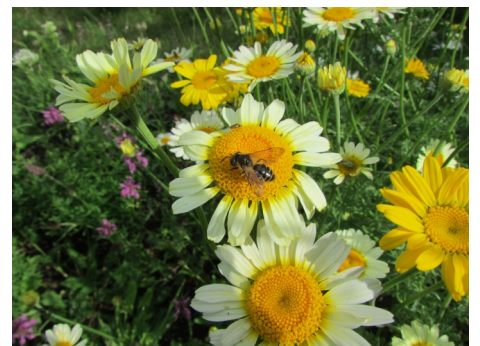
The price is also shown along with the wildlife species it may attract and provide food for.

Native Wildflower

An RHS Plants for Pollinators Plant

This plant is listed in either the Bat Conservation Trust "Encouraging bats, A guide for bat-friendly garden and living" or the "RHS Plants for Bats list".

Plant flowers, set seeds and dies over the course of one year.

The plant forms leaves the first year and flowers in the second, set seeds and dies.

Plant usually flowers in the second year, (sometimes the first), dies down in the winter but re-emerges in spring for several years.

Has been present in Great Britain since at least the last ice age.

Flowers for Wildlife

Achillea - Pink Mix - *Achillea millefolium*

£2.00

Perennial Cottage Garden Flower - 60cm - Sow February to July - Flowers May to August - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 900 seeds / 0.3g

RHS P4P Bats and some moths including larvae of the Belted Beauty moth.

A very attractive mix with flowers of palest pink through to deep pink. Long flowering, good cut flower, tolerant of drought once established.

Anise Hyssop - *Agastache foeniculum*

Perennial Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 1m - Flowers summer - Inside - Sow inside in spring or summer, needs warmth at approx.15-18°C to germinate - Prefers full sun in well-drained soil. Will need winter protection in areas where the temperature falls below -5°C - Approx. 300 seeds / 0.15g

RHS P4P Bees



Anise Hyssop is a clump-forming plant with highly aromatic aniseed scented leaves. The pretty purple flower spikes are very popular with Bees and other pollinating insects. Dave Goulson in his, Gardening for Bumblebees calls it "One of the very best plants for bees,"

Betony – *Betonica officinalis*

Perennial Native Wildflower - 40-60 cm - Flowers summer to early autumn - Sow late summer or autumn, needs cold to germinate - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 160 seeds / 0.27g

RHS P4P Bumblebees, solitary Bees

A pretty plant with pinkish purple flowers.

Bird's Foot Trefoil - *Lotus corniculatus*

Perennial Native Wildflower - 35 cm - Flowers throughout the summer - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 150 seeds / 0.3g

RHS P4P Bees, both adults and larvae of Butterflies and Moths

Yellow pea-type flowers with red-tinged buds. Can be grown in lawns providing they are given a "high cut" during the flowering season. Perfectly at home in flower beds and hanging baskets and planters where it will drape over the sides.

Borage - *Borago officinalis* - Organically Grown Seeds

Annual Herb - 60 cm - Flowers throughout summer to early autumn - Sow spring, early summer, early autumn - Any reasonably well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 120 seeds / 2g

RHS P4P Bees, Moths, Bats

Bright blue edible starry flowers, (can be frozen into ice cubes). Hairy leaves with a cucumber flavour can be added to drinks such as Pimms.

Californian Poppy - 'Mission Bells' - *Exchscholzia californica*

Hardy Annual Cottage Garden Flower - 25 cm - Flowers early summer to autumn - Sow spring, early summer, early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 300 seeds / 0.42g

RHS P4P Bees, Hoverflies

Compact bushy plants with feathery leaves and single or semi-double flowers in yellow, orange, pink or red. Very easy to grow and often self-seeds. We recommend successive sowing for flowers all summer long.

Cat's Ear - *Hypochaeris radicata*

Perennial Native Wildflower - 50 cm - Flowers summer to autumn - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 150 seeds / 0.15g

RHS P4P Bees, Hoverflies



Cat's ear is a rosette-forming plant with hairy long leaves and bright yellow flowers similar to Dandelion, in summer through to early autumn. It is very popular with Hoverflies and Bees, particularly the smaller solitary bees.



Chicory - *Cichorium intybus*

Perennial Naturalised Wildflower - 1-15 m - Flowers in summer - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Rich, well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 400 seeds / 0.5g






RHS P4P Hoverflies, Bumblebees, Honeybees

Tall plant with beautiful blue flowers along its stem. The fresh young leaves and edible flowers can be added to salads.




<p>Chives - <i>Allium schoenoprasum</i> - Organically Grown Seeds £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Culinary Herb - 30 cm - Flowers in summer - Sow late spring, or summer - Prefers rich, moist soil in sun but will tolerate most soils and conditions - Approx. 300 seeds / 1g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies</p> <p>The grass-like leaves have a mild onion flavour. The purplish/pink globe flowers are also edible. Can be used whenever a mild onion flavour is needed.</p>
<p>Clary Sage - <i>Salvia sclarea</i> - Organically Grown Seeds £2.00</p> <p>Biennial Herb - 1m - Flowers summer - Sow late spring to early autumn - Moist but well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 100 seeds / 0.4g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bumblebees and Moths, including the caterpillars of Mint Moth.</p> <p>A very attractive tall plant with strongly scented wrinkly leaves and very pretty pale pink flowers with mauve bracts.</p>
<p>Columbine - <i>Aquilegia vulgaris</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers May to July - Sow late summer or autumn as a cold spell needed for germination - Prefers moist soil in partial shade - Approx. 180 seeds / 0.26g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bumblebees</p> <p>This is the true wild form of Columbine with purplish blue flowers with hooked spurs. In the wild, most often found in woodland clearings.</p>
<p>Comfrey - <i>Symphytum officinale</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1.5m - Flowers late spring and summer - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Moist, fertile soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 50 seeds / 0.52g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees and Moths including larvae of Scarlet Tiger Moth</p> <p>A non-edible herb with large leaves and nodding clusters of purple tubular flowers. The leaves can be used as a compost activator, as a mulch or to make a liquid manure.</p> <p>Warning: Comfrey is harmful if eaten and contact with the foliage may irritate the skin or eyes.</p>
<p>Common Knapweed - <i>Centaurea nigra</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - 75 cm - Flowers June to September - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 150 seeds / 0.33g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths, Beetles, Birds, Bats</p> <p>Thistle-like purple flowers from very attractive buds. Loved by seed-eaters such as goldfinches.</p> 
<p>Common Toadflax - <i>Linaria vulgaris</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - 75 cm - Flowers from June throughout summer - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 500 seeds / 0.07g</p> <p>RHS P4P Moths and Bees including Buff-tailed and White-tailed Bumblebees</p> <p>Very attractive creamy yellow and orange "snapdragon" flowers.</p> 
<p>Corn Chamomile - <i>Anthemis arvensis</i> £2.00</p> <p>Annual Naturalised Wildflower - 20-30 cm - Flowers summer to early autumn - Sow spring, early summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 4400 seeds / 1.1g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths, Hoverflies</p> <p>Feathery aromatic leaves and daisy-like flowers with white petals and a yellow centre. Very pretty, long-lasting flowers loved by pollinators.</p>
<p>Corncockle - <i>Agrostemma githago</i> £2.00</p> <p>Annual Naturalised Wildflower - 75 cm - Flowers in summer - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 75 seeds / 1.25g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bats</p> <p>Warning: All parts of this plant and particularly the seeds are toxic. Do not eat and keep away from children and pets.</p>
<p>Cornflower - <i>Centaurea cyanus</i> £2.00</p> <p>Annual Naturalised Wildflower - 80 cm - Flowers summer & autumn - Sow spring or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 200 seeds / 1g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Bats</p> <p>Soft green leaves with blue flowers. Although the individual flowers are short-lived, new ones continually open all summer into autumn.</p>

<p>Cornflower - 'Polka Dot Mixed' - <i>Centaurea cyanus</i> £2.00</p> <p>Annual Cottage Garden Flower - 40 cm - Flowers summer & autumn - Sow spring or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 200 seeds / 1g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Bats</p> <p>Soft green leaves with very pretty flowers in shades from pale pink, blue to deep purple. Not as tall as the native blue Cornflower but still as popular with pollinators.</p>
<p>Corn Marigold - <i>Glebionis segetum</i> £2.00</p> <p>Annual Naturalised Wildflower - 30 cm - Flowers summer - Sow spring and early summer - Will tolerate most soils in sun - Approx. 350 seeds / 0.58g</p> <p>RHS P4P Butterflies, Bees, Moths, Bats and Hoverflies</p> <p>An upright plant with large bright yellow daisy-like flowers, very popular with pollinators.</p>
<p>Cosmos - 'Sensation Mixed' - <i>Cosmos bipinnatus</i> £2.00</p> <p>Cottage Garden Flower - 1m - Flowers all summer until the first frosts - Sow spring- Well-drained soil in sun or partial - Approx. 100 seeds / 0.7g</p> <p>RHS P4P Hoverflies, Bees, Bats</p> <p>A tall plant with feathery leaves and large single flowers with yellow centres. This variety has flowers in shades of white through to deep pink.</p>
<p>Crimson-flowered flax - <i>Linum grandiflorum</i> £2.00</p> <p>Annual Cottage Garden Flower - 35 cm - Flowers in summer, make successive sowings for flowers all season - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 500 seeds / 1.9g</p> <p>A good source of both nectar and pollen for insects.</p> <p>Very pretty plant with narrow leaves and deep red silky flowers. Best grown in groups rather than singly.</p>
<p>Dandelion - <i>Taraxacum officinale</i> £2.00 NEW!</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 40 cm - Flowers March to October - Sow outside in spring, summer, early autumn - Happy in most soils and positions in full sun or partial shade - Approx. 800 seeds / 0.46g</p> <p>Bumblebees and Solitary Bees, Butterflies, Finches, Moths and Hoverflies</p> <p>This is the common Dandelion with its cheerful yellow flowers, which close at night, and "clock" seedheads. Flowers from spring to autumn with an abundance of flowers in April when it provides a good source of nectar for early insects. As well as being an incredibly useful plant for wildlife, it also has many uses in herbal medicine.</p>
<p>Devil's-bit Scabious - <i>Succisa pratensis</i> £2.00</p> <p>Native Perennial Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers summer to autumn - Sow late summer or autumn as the seeds need a period of cold to germinate - Damp to reasonably free-draining soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 100 seeds / 0.15g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Hoverflies, Butterflies, Moths and Bats</p> <p>Purple pincushion-like flowerheads which provide a nectar source for bees and many other pollinators. It is also a food plant for caterpillars of various Moths and Butterflies including the rare Marsh Fritillary Butterfly.</p>
<p>Dyer's Chamomile - <i>Anthemis tinctoria</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Cottage Garden Flower / Dye plant - 1m - Flowers late spring to early autumn - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 450 seeds / 0.17g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bumblebees, Solitary Bees, Hoverflies, Bats</p> <p>Very pretty daisy-like flowers in shades from cream to bright yellow above fragrant, finely cut leaves. Very popular with Bees and Hoverflies</p>
<p>Elecampane - <i>Inula helenium</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Naturalised Wildflower - 2m - Flowers summer - Sow spring, summer or early autumn - Prefers rich, deep, moisture-retentive soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 50 seeds / 0.09g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Hoverflies, Ground Beetles</p> <p>Very tall, impressive plant with leaves up to 60cm long. Large yellow flowers loved by Bees and Hoverflies. It may take a couple of years to reach full size and is unlikely to flower in the first year but it is worth waiting for.</p>
<p>Fennel - <i>Foeniculum vulgare</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Culinary Herb - Up to 2m - Flowers summer - Sow mid-spring to early autumn - Fertile well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 500 seeds / 2.17g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Wasps, Beetles, Hoverflies, Lacewings and Bats</p> <p>A tall impressive herb with feather leaves and umbels of yellow flowers which are very attractive to a wide range of beneficial insects. All of the plant has a distinctive, aniseed scent and taste. A very attractive, useful plant for both the herb garden and flower beds.</p>



<p>Field Scabious - <i>Knautia arvensis</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers June to October - Sow spring, summer, early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 50 seeds / 0.4g</p> <p>RHS P4P Butterflies, Hoverflies, Bees, Bats, Moths, Birds</p> <p>A clump-forming plant with lilac-blue flowers which are a valuable nectar source for pollinators. The seeds provide food for some bird species.</p>	
<p>Fox and Cubs - <i>Pilosella aurantiaca</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 50cm - Flowers summer - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 300 seeds / 0.04g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths</p> <p>Fox and cubs has a rosette of leaves at the base of the plant. The stems are topped with flowerheads, similar to dandelions, but with a cluster of hairy buds, (the cubs), beneath the open orange flowers which are particularly popular with smaller leaf-cutter bees. Self-seeds readily.</p>	
<p>Foxglove - <i>Digitalis purpurea</i> £2.00</p> <p>Biennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers summer - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Moist but well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 5000 seeds / 0.38g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bumblebees, Butterflies, Moths</p> <p>These tall wildflowers are very popular with Bumblebees not only as a source of pollen but sometimes also as an overnight roosting place. Often found in woodland, it is happy in partial shade but will also tolerate other sites.</p> <p>Warning: All parts of the plant are poisonous.</p>	
<p>Granny's Bonnets - Surprise Mix - <i>Aquilegia</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 1m - Flowers from late spring to early to mid-summer - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Moist or well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 150 seeds / 0.27g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies</p> <p>An easy to grow cottage garden favourite which will happily self-seed around your garden. These seeds are from the various Granny's Bonnets in our garden which include plants of various heights and colours from white through to dark purple. As the Bees have cross-pollinated these plants your seedlings may be single, double, bi-coloured, short or tall, but all will be pretty.</p>	
<p>Greater Knapweed - <i>Centaurea scabiosa</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers summer into early autumn - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Moist but well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 45 seeds / 0.3g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths, Bats</p> <p>An upright plant with attractive buds opening to purple flowers. Very popular with Bees, Butterflies and Moths. A really striking plant for your flower border.</p>	
<p>Great Mullein - <i>Verbascum thapsus</i> £2.00</p> <p>Biennial Native Wildflower - Up to 2m - Flowers summer - Sow spring, summer or autumn - Well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 1400 seeds / 0.14g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Moths, Bats</p> <p>Great Mullein has a rosette of large, soft, woolly grey-green leaves in the first year. In the second, a tall flowering stem appears covered in yellow blooms. Wool Carder Bees may collect the soft hairs from the leaves for nesting material. The flowers are attractive to pollinators and also the Mullein Moth which has attractive yellow, black and white caterpillars.</p>	
<p>Gypsophila—'Covent Garden' - <i>Gypsophila elegans</i> £2.00</p> <p>Annual Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 45cm - Flowers summer - Sow spring to June or in September - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 1200 seeds / 1.5g</p> <p>RHS P4P Particularly popular with Hoverflies</p> <p>A graceful and delicate-looking plant with lacy green foliage and white flowers, also known as Baby's Breath.</p>	

<p>Hemp Agrimony - <i>Eupatorium cannabinum</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1.5m - Flowers late summer to early autumn - Sow spring, summer, early autumn. - Damp soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 300 seeds / 0.1g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies, Moths, Bats</p> <p>A tall upright bushy plant with reddish stems and clusters of tiny light pink flowers from late summer into autumn. In the wild, often found in marshes and damp grassland or woodlands. The flowers attract many different kinds of insects including Red Admiral and Small Tortoiseshell Butterflies.</p>
<p>Hollyhock - Single Mixed - <i>Alcea Rosea</i> £2.00</p> <p>Biennial / Short-lived perennial Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 2m - Flowers summer - Sow late spring or summer - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 50 seeds / 0.5g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Bats</p> <p>Tall, imposing plants with large single, open, saucer-like flowers in lovely shades from white to crimson. Very attractive to Bumblebees.</p>
<p>Honesty - Purple and white mix - <i>Lunaria annual</i> £2.00</p> <p>Biennial Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 75 cm - Flowers late spring to summer - Sow late spring or summer - Moist but well-drained soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 80 seeds / 1.6g</p> <p>RHS P4P Butterflies, Bats</p> <p>The pretty flowers are followed by very decorative seedheads. The Orange-Tip Butterfly lays its eggs on Honesty which provides food for their caterpillars.</p>
<p>Hyssop - <i>Hyssopus officinalis</i> £2.00</p> <p>Hardy Perennial Herb - Up to 80cm - Flowers summer - Sow late spring to early autumn - Well-drained soil in sun - Approx. 500 seeds / 0.6g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Bats</p> <p>A semi-evergreen shrubby herb with aromatic leaves and blue flowers. A good plant for hedging and loved by pollinators.</p>
<p>Lady's Bedstraw - <i>Galium verum</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 50cm - Flowers June to September - Sow spring, summer, autumn - Moist to well-drained, neutral to alkaline infertile soil, in sun or semi-shade - Approx. 500 seeds / 0.6g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Moths including the caterpillars of several Hawk-moths.</p> <p>This wildflower has a sprawling habit and frothy golden-yellow honey-scented flowers. It smells like new mown hay when dried.</p>
<p>Lavatera 'Mont Blanc' - <i>Lavatera trimestris</i> £2.00</p> <p>Annual Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 60cm - Flowers June to September - Sow March to May - Well-drained soil in sun with some shelter from the wind - Approx. 100 seeds / 0.64g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees</p> <p>A dwarf mallow variety with a bushy habit, dark green leaves and glistening large white flowers which are very attractive to bees.</p>
<p>Lemon Balm - <i>Melissa officinalis</i> - <i>Organically Grown Seeds</i> £2.00</p> <p>Hardy Perennial Herb - Up to 80cm - Flowers summer - Sow spring, summer, early autumn - Any soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 800 seeds / 0.4g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Bats</p> <p>Lemon Balm has very small white flowers and fresh green leaves with a lemon scent and flavour. Also known as Bee Balm, its flowers are nectar and pollen rich. It can be used whenever a lemon flavour is needed in either sweet or savoury dishes but avoid cooking as it loses its lemon flavour. Perfect for adding to cold drinks or blending in yoghurt.</p>
<p>Limnanthes "Poached Egg Plant" - <i>Limnanthes douglasii</i> £2.00</p> <p>Annual Cottage Garden Flower - Up to 15cm - Flowers summer into autumn - Sow spring to early summer, early autumn - Moist soil in a sunny spot - Approx. 75 seeds / 0.58g</p> <p>RHS P4P Hoverflies, Bats</p> <p>A bushy spreading plant with divided leaves and yellow flowers with white tips. A very useful ground-cover plant and loved by pollinators, especially Hoverflies.</p>

<p>Lovage - <i>Levesticum officinale</i> £2.00</p> <p>Hardy Perennial Herb - Up to 2m - Flowers summer - Sow late spring to summer - Well-drained, rich, moist soil in sun or partial shade - Approx. 130 seeds / 0.35g</p> <p>RHS P4P Solitary Bees, Wasps, Hoverflies, Soldier Beetles</p> <p>A tall herb with celery-flavoured leaves and yellow clusters of flowers in summer. It can be used to flavour stews and soups and the young leaves can be used in salads. (Use sparingly as it has quite a strong flavour).</p>
<p>Marsh-mallow - <i>Althaea officinalis</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 2.5m - Flowers summer to early autumn - Sow late summer to autumn, the seeds need a period of cold before they will germinate well. You may get a few seedlings from a mid-summer sowing - Prefers a moist soil in sun but will tolerate other conditions including drier soil and partial shade - Approx. 110 seeds / 0.2g</p> <p>Bees, Hoverflies, Marsh-mallow Moth caterpillars and Bats </p> <p>Marsh-mallow is a tall plant with soft grey-green leaves and very pretty pale pink flowers from mid-summer into autumn. It is a very good plant for a damp position in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p>Meadow Crane's-bill - <i>Geranium pratense</i> £2.00</p> <p>Perennial Native Wildflower - Up to 1m - Flowers June to September - Sow spring, summer, early autumn - Moist but well-drained soil, in sun or partial shade - Approx. 75 seeds / 0.75g</p> <p>RHS P4P Bees, Butterflies </p> <p>A clump-forming plant with violet flowers and deeply cut leaves. The attractive flowers are nectar-rich and loved by Bees.</p>
